SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS

Reports by Department Heads

OEM Director Harry Heller noted he had attended the "Dam Failure Drill" in Lambertville yesterday and commented that it seemed to be more internally related to Lambertville. Director Heller also noted that last month Pat Pittore ran a CPR Class for the DPW with another class planned for the municipal office staff in January. Additionally, Director Heller noted a total of \$240, 855 in FEMA funds have been awarded to the Township along with a total of \$471,000 in USDA funds. He remarked the Township should also be getting \$58,000 more from FEMA to assist with the Stymiest Road repairs.

NEW BUSINESS

<u>Discussion: Permission for EMS Staff to Conduct Search & Rescue Training on Municipal Property</u> Present for the discussion was Pat Pittore. He explained he and his wife have a canine rescue unit and asked if they could utilize the municipal property to train their dogs. He noted it would only be 1 or 2 times annually, probably on a Sunday, and stated they have liability insurance and would only be working in the area behind the building in the tree line and maybe at the depot. Mr. Pittore noted he

would coordinate with the Township Clerk, Police Department and DPW prior to coming to the property.

It was noted for the record that the Committee took no issue with Mr. Pittore training his dogs on the municipal property as long as he notified the proper departments before doing so.

<u>Discussion: Possible Refund of Trash Permit Fee to E. Hinrichsen</u>

It was noted for the record that the Committee recognized Mr. Hinrichsen apparently had some sort of verbal altercation with Depot staff over what type of trash/recycling that can be accepted at the depot and has since decided to contract with a private hauler for his garbage services. The Committee decided to uphold the current policy and denied Mr. Hinrichsen's request for a refund of his trash permit fees because it is clearly stated on the permit that the fees are non-refundable. It was also noted that the Committee believes the depot staff has a responsibility to monitor what is collected in the dumpsters and that it was Mr. Hinrichsen's choice to contract with a private garbage service.

Discussion: Possibly Establishing "Office Hours" for Committee Members

Deputy Mayor Hoyer explained that it was suggested the Committee Members hold office hours once a month in order to give the public an opportunity to meet with them. He noted the Committee would rotate time slots once a month, every 5 weeks. Mayor Cally advised everyone to think about establishing office hours.

<u>Discussion: Township Animal Control Services – Possible Authorization of Contract</u>

After some discussion the Committee agreed to contract with Animal Control Solutions for services in 2023. There was some continued discussion on a 1 year vs. 3 year contract with Clerk Andrews noting she would look into it further.

Authorization for Lieutenant Skillman to Hire an Additional Patrolman

A motion was made by Hoyer and seconded by Cally authorizing Lieutenant Skillman to start the process to hire an additional Patrolman. The motion was unanimously approved by voice vote.

STANDING COMMITTEE REPORTS

- A. Open Space: Chairman of the Committee John Cronce commented on a previous discussion regarding the Dupuis property abutting Hewitt Park. He noted the property is not contiguous. He then provided an update on the preservation signage, saying it is all up now. Next he updated the Committee on the following matters:
 - 1. He remarked that for the first time in 16 years there was a trespasser hunting on Township property. He confirmed the Police Department handled the situation
 - 2. He commented the Wooden Farm is changing their farming and may be producing grain in their back field
 - 3. He suggested a Certificate of Insurance be obtained from the Fulper Farm for the farming they do on Township property
- B. Environmental: No report was given.
- C. Ag Advisory: No report was given.
- D. Finance Committee: No report given.

OPEN TO THE PUBLIC

Mayor Cally opened the floor to public comment. Seeing no members of the public come forward, a motion was made by Dale and seconded by Cally to close the floor to public comment. The motion was unanimously approved by voice vote.
