December 27, 2018 - 7:30 p.m.

CALL TO ORDER AND STATEMENT OF COMPLIANCE WITH THE OPEN PUBLIC MEETINGS ACT

The regularly scheduled meeting of the West Amwell Township Committee was called to order at 7:30 PM. Present were Mayor Stephen Bergenfeld, Deputy Mayor Gary Hoyer, Committeemen James Cally, John Dale and Zachary Rich, Acting Clerk Maria Andrews and Attorney Philip J. Faherty III.

Acting Clerk Andrews announced that this meeting is called pursuant to the provisions of the Open Public Meetings Act. Notice of this meeting was faxed to the Hunterdon County Democrat and Trenton Times on January 5, 2018, was posted on the bulletin board in the Municipal Building on said date and has remained continuously posted as required under the Statute. A copy of this notice is and has been available to the public and is on file in the office of the Acting Municipal Clerk.

FLAG SALUTE

Mayor Bergenfeld led those in attendance in the pledge to the nation's flag.

AGENDA REVIEW BY ACTING TOWNSHIP CLERK

Acting Clerk Andrews noted the Covanta waste management agreement had been received. Mayor Bergenfeld noted the matter will be added under New Business for discussion.

PRESENTATION OF MINUTES

A motion by Cally, seconded by Dale to approve the Township Committee's 12/5/18 minutes as revised was unanimously approved by voice vote.

OPEN TO THE PUBLIC/TOPICS NOT ON THE AGENDA

Mayor Bergenfeld opened the floor to public comment. Harry Heller of 27 Old York Road came forward and requested the Committee consider implementing a requirement that adjoining property owners are notified when new septic systems are being installed. He explained that the property next door to him recently sold and the new owners had contractors working up until 10 PM on some evenings to install the new septic system. He noted the mound is at least 8' to 10' high and he believes it's only 20 ft. from the property line. Mr. Heller expressed concern that the system may not have been constructed according to the approved plans.

Local Contractor John Cronce spoke up from the public offering an explanation for the late night construction saying one of his jobs was delayed due to a tank delivery truck breaking down.

Mayor Bergenfeld stated that he doesn't believe property owners are under any obligation to notify adjoining property owners of new septic installations and suggested that Mr. Heller reach out to the County Board of Health if he believes the system was not constructed according to the approved plans since they have jurisdiction to enforce any violations.

Seeing no other members of the public come forward, a motion was made by Cally and seconded by Dale to close the floor to public comment. The motion was unanimously approved by voice vote.

SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS

Reports by Department Heads

Mr. Heller, as the Director of OEM, gave a quick report indicating they had a peaceful year. He noted he had not spent any of his budgeted money for the year and that there were no situations that required FEMA funding in 2018. Mr. Heller also stated that OEM is in the process of trying to get a generator.

<u>Public Hearing</u>: Ordinance 12, 2018 – AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 153, SECTION 153-21 OF THE CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WEST AMWELL, COUNTY OF HUNTERDON, STATE OF NEW JERSEY: *Installation of "Multi-Way" Stop Control at the Intersection of Rock Road West and Corsalo Road*

Ordinance 12, 2018

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 153, SECTION 153-21 OF THE CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WEST AMWELL, COUNTY OF HUNTERDON, STATE OF NEW JERSEY Installation of "Multi-Way" Stop Control at the Intersection of Rock Road West and Corsalo Road

WHEREAS, the Township Committee of the Township of West Amwell, County of Hunterdon, State of New Jersey, finds it in the interest of public safety to designate Rock Road West and Corsalo Road as a Multi-Way Stop Intersection pursuant to N.J.S.A. 39:4-8;

WHEREAS, the Municipal Engineer has submitted and certified all the legislative requirements pursuant to N.J.S.A. 39:4-8, and the criteria as set forth by the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD) have been met;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Committee of the Township of West Amwell, County of Hunterdon, State of New Jersey that Chapter 153, Section 153-21, Multiway stop intersections, be amended as follows:

Section 1

Multi- Way Stop Intersection:

Pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 39:4-140, the intersections herein described are designated as multiway stop intersections. Stop signs shall be installed as provided herein.

Intersection Stop Signs On:

Rock Road West and Corsalo Road All approaches

<u>Penalties:</u> Unless another penalty is expressly provided by New Jersey Statute, every person convicted of a violation of any provision of this Ordinance or any supplement thereto shall be liable to the penalty of not more than fifty dollars (\$ 50.00) or imprisonment for a term not to exceed fifteen (15) days or both.

Section 2

All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed and this Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and upon the installation of the required signs and pavement markings.

Section 3

This Ordinance shall become effective upon final passage and publication according to law.

Attorney Faherty explained he is still working with Attorney Spillman on determining what the post-sale operations will be and who the Township's contact person will be. He also noted that he has determined the project is transferable.

Attorney Faherty stated nothing else in the contract has been changed.

With regard to the bond Mr. Rich had referred to in a prior meeting, Attorney Faherty said neither West Amwell or Lambertville has a record of such funds and believes that the bond may never have been established.

Mr. Hoyer asked why West Amwell is referred to as the "Landlord" throughout the lease agreement. Attorney Faherty indicated he didn't know but stated the new agreement refers back to the original documents so the landlord reference doesn't matter.

Mayor Bergenfeld requested the matter be carried to the Committee's 1/16/19 regular meeting agenda.

Re-location of Police HQ to Basement - Status Update

Mayor Bergenfeld explained the painter will be at the building tomorrow to perform some prep work for the paint spraying which will likely take place over the upcoming weekend.

Donation from JCP&L and Enbridge for Class III Officer Training

Mayor Bergenfeld noted he has secured an \$1150.00 donation from JCP&L for the Class III Officer's to provide educational training to the students. He remarked he believes Enbridge will also be providing the same amount but has not yet received confirmation.

<u>Discussion: Authorization to Seek an Appraiser for COAH Requirements/Settlement Agreement</u>

Clerk Andrews explained Attorney St. Angelo had indicated the Committee needs to authorize an appraiser be sought if needed to facilitate implementing the Township's COAH requirements under the pending Settlement Agreement.

Mr. Cronce spoke up from the public and indicated Mr. Schiable of Vanguard Appraisal Services has been used for Open Space preservation projects in the past.

Mayor Bergenfeld noted he is familiar with Appraiser Gary Tighue in Hamilton, NJ and remarked that with the Township's QPA, we don't need quotes for any job under \$6000.

It was noted for the record that the Committee took no issue with an appraiser being contacted regarding COAH matters.

Discussion: Email Dated 12/13/18 from Qscend, re: Email Service

Clerk Andrews noted the Township's email service host has indicated that as of July 1, 2019 they will no longer support West Amwell's email service due to their limited storage capabilities. Mr. Beaumont spoke up from the public suggesting the Township's Technology Committee get involved to research other options and requested a copy of the letter from Qscend.

Discussion: Proposed Increased Zoning Permit Fees

It was noted for the record that Zoning Officer Baldino is suggesting 2 minor increases in the amounts of \$25.00 each as well as the addition of specific language to reference retaining walls.
